2024-2025 SECONDARY SCHOOL PROFILE

THE SCHOOL: CCB is a co-educational, private, day school that offers an instructional programme from Early Childhood (18 months of age) up to Grade 12 (18 years of age). Founded in 1956 as a non-profit making institution, the school is governed by a Board of Governors and is committed to fostering moral, social, and academic excellence in an enriching bilingual environment (English-Spanish) with French classes in grades 5-8 (offered as an elective thereafter in grades 9th and 10th).

ACCREDITATION: CCB is fully accredited by the Council of International Schools (CIS). Since 1977, the International Baccalaureate Organization based in Geneva, Switzerland, authorised CCB to offer the IB Diploma Programme (DP); in 2007 CCB was authorised to offer the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP); in 2011, the Middle Years Programme (MYP) and now we also have the IB Career-Related Programme (CP). Additionally, the School is authorised by the Colombian Ministry of Education to offer the Colombian Baccalaureate Diploma.

THE SETTING: CCB is located on a beautiful green 28.6-acre (116,000m2) campus in Pance, a residential southern suburb of Cali where most of the independent schools and universities are located. Cali is a warm city in Colombia, South America.

THE SECONDARY SCHOOL: The Section comprises a Head of the Secondary School, a Deputy Head, a Well-Being Coordinator, a Learning Support Programme (LSP) Coordinator, the IB MYP & DP-CP Coordinators, Subject Coordinators, Grade Coordinators, ICFES Coordinator, CAS Coordinator more than 70 full-time teachers, three psychologists, an International Programs Coordinator and an assistant who coordinate the exchanges and academic integration programs all over the world, a DP College Placement Counsellor, and a Child Protection Officer for the whole school.

THE STUDENTS: CCB has a total enrolment of approximately 1,200 students of which 484 are in grades 6 to 12 in the Secondary School. 90% are Colombian nationals and 10% are from other nationalities. The average student-teacher ratio in the entire school is 8:1. Our graduates are accepted into highly selective universities around the world.

THE CALENDAR: The CCB academic calendar for secondary students is a three-trimester year. It starts in the third week of August and finishes in the middle of June. Classes are held Monday through Friday, with a six-day rotation schedule, with 6 periods of 60 minutes. Examinations are held in December and in June with mock exams for grades 11th and 12th. The final grades awarded at the end of the year are based on the evaluation of the performance during the whole year and are based on prescribed criteria.

THE CURRICULUM: The Secondary School offers a unique curriculum that integrates seven years of the Colombian National Curriculum with the International Baccalaureate Programmes. Our students are in the IB MYP from 6th to 10th Grade. In 10th grade, in addition to the regular subjects, students can take electives and AP courses. In 11th and 12th Grade, students will be enrolled in the IB Diploma Programme or the IB Career-oriented Programme, and at the same time, they fulfil the Colombian national curriculum and graduate with two Diplomas. The IB Diploma requires that six subjects be studied, together with an assessed course in Theory of Knowledge (TOK), participation in Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS), and the writing of an Extended Essay (EE). Of the six groups, three subjects must be studied at a Higher Level (HL-240 hours of instruction over the two-year course) and three subjects at a Standard Level (SL-150 hours). The students who go for the CP IB Diploma are required to take their Professional Studies at two local universities in the areas of Business Management or Medicine and three IB Diploma subjects besides the core components. Students are awarded the IB Diploma upon successful completion of the requirements of the International Baccalaureate Organization. In the CP Programme, students will take their Professional Studies at two local universities, in the areas of Medicine and Business Administration.

September 2008 onwards, CCB implemented the International Baccalaureate grading system (1-7, with 7 being the highest score and 4 the passing grade). Our teachers demand very high academic standards from the students. From 6th to 10th grade, students' averages are graded on an unweighted scale. In 11th and 12th grades of the IB Diploma Programme, there is a weighted scale to calculate averages of the IB subjects, multiplying Higher Level subject grades by 1.25 and Standard Level subject grades by 1.1. We do not have a credit system to calculate the GPA. Instead, we provide averages.

Although our School is an authorised centre for the PSAT, SAT and AP, it is important to mention that our curriculum does not include any preparation for such tests. Our students prepare themselves for these examinations on their own and in their free time.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS AT CCB

Students must:

- 1. Complete 12th Grade with all of the subjects approved with 4.0 or more.
- 2. Present the Colombian Official State Examination called "Pruebas Saber 11".
- 3. FOR DP IB Diploma students: Present an extended essay of 4.000 words, a final Theory of Knowledge Essay and comply with Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) requirements.
- 4. Comply with all CP core requirements.
- 5. Be up to date with all school financial obligations and graduation fees.

ELECTIVES AND VIRTUAL HIGH SCHOOL IN MYP

In the timetable, students have 6 periods in the 6 day cycle for electives:

ART AND DESIGN IN GRADES 6-8	Between grades 6-8, all students are assigned two courses of the arts (Either art, music or theatre). All students take French classes in grades 6-8.
ELECTIVES GRADES 9-10	In 9th and 10th grade, students have six periods in the six- day-cycle for 2 electives. Each elective takes 3 periods in the cycle. Students can take two different electives per year. Electives offered are: Visual Arts, Theatre, Music, Band, Digital Design, Product Design, Computer Science, Creative Writing in English and Spanish and French.
VIRTUAL HIGH SCHOOL	They can replace one of their CCB electives with a Virtual High School course (https://vhslearning.org/). Virtual high school offers more than 200 online, accredited courses for high school students. It offers 24 online Advanced Placement (AP) courses and CCB is an approved AP testing centre (https://vhslearning.org/advanced-placement).


EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES: Field trips, musical presentations and plays, science and reading clubs, cultural programmes, drama productions, Environmental programme, Model UN, National Honor Society, Poetry Festival are some examples of activities that we offer. Community service events are an important part of the whole school programme involving students, parents and teachers.

SPORTS: Secondary students participate in the following sports: basketball, soccer, volleyball, table tennis, Olympic gymnastics, skating, judo and swimming. They also play tennis and golf at other facilities. Our teams compete in local, regional and national tournaments. Students regularly represent Colombia at international tournaments. We have a strong High Performance Athletes programme in place and these students receive support from the academic staff.


